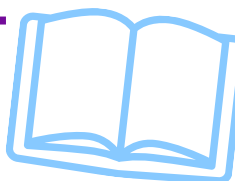

The year 2023 dawned with a flurry of anticipation at the Mifflin County Library, as the world emerged from its hibernation. Laughter and chatter of little ones filled the air, as in-person programs for children of all ages resumed, beckoning kids to revel in the joys of friendship and the magic of books. The unveiling of a new adult services programmer brought in a fresh wave of excitement, with craft activities for grown-ups becoming an instant hit. The Lewistown and Kish Library Book Groups joined forces, while Crafterday Saturdays thrilled patrons with monthly crafts to explore.

The library's noble deeds also extended beyond the world of books. In partnership with the Mifflin County Commissioners, MCL received the coveted Keystone Grant to improve its infrastructure, with plans to commence in January 2024. The first phase is scheduled to conclude in September, during which time the children's library will be temporarily housed on the upper level. Additionally, MCL identified a community need in October 2023: the absence of an agency providing FBI fingerprinting for Keep Kids Safe Clearances. In just a short amount of time, 367 employees had their fingerprints taken by the library for work purposes.

Children's Programs

Take & Make activities are available on a first come first serve basis. The children's department offers a new Take & Make every two weeks while supplies last for children to take home to complete.



Storytime is offered in the Fall, Winter and Spring for children birth through preschool. Storytime space is limited and registration is required. Upcoming storytimes are advertised on the library's Facebook page and website.

Summer reading programs and activities occur each summer for children age birth through 18 years old. Watch for information in early June.

Glitter & Chaos is a crafting program held once a month during the school year for students in first through fifth grade. Each month is a new craft. Registration is required.
